Mrs. Jones was buried on Monday November 21, 1988 at Elmwood Cemetary. Her burial plot is located at Block #39-A, Lot S-1/2-183. Public corruption, U. S. Attorney's Office from N/A murder cover-up of rich citizen's death

My name is William Anthony Eager. I am presently being held in false imprisonment on a forged indictment scheme at the Atlanta Federal Prison Camp in Atlanta, Georgia, which is by abuse of power from corrupt officials from the Northern District of Alabama who have committed and participated in one of the most heinous murder cover-up crimes in American history, that originated in Birmingham, Alabama by concealing a rich citizen's murder, Ms. Ada Lee Mays Jones.

Public Corruption at the U.S. Attorneys' Office, in the murder and cover-up of the late Ms. Ada Mays Jones ... A Rich Citizen's Death

Follow up from June 12, 2008

My name is William Anthony Fagnes, I am being held in peonage at the Atlanta Federal Prison camp in Atlanta Georgia. On June 12, 2008, I was featured in a news story related to the death of Mrs. Ada Mays Jones, and because I have information related to her death that involves the U. S. Attorney's Office, FBI, Federal Judges and members of the legislature I have been incarcerated to suppress, conceal and mutilate evidence relating to the truth:

The case that was manufactured against me and the cover-up to keep me held in prison on a fraudulent indictment scheme is an abuse of power by the district judges, appeals court judges in both Alabama and Georgia, who have conspired together to protect bar members' misconduct in this criminal enterprise operating under the "Color of Law."

This case was created to embezzle the estate of Ms. Ada Mays Jones out from under the rightful heirs, Mr. and Mrs. William Anthony Fagnes. Ms. Ada Mays Jones was the richest African American woman in Alabama in the 1980s which is the largest murder cover-up conducted by the government against an African American woman since the slave trade in Alabama. This case involves more the 35 million United States dollars. This is why the efforts and activity to lock away the heirs has been so great. The criminal enterprise operates on all levels of government to exercise their powers in efforts to cover for each other from one court to the next.

Ms. Ada Jones was bequeathed this fortune from her mother who was born on December 25, 1898 and passed away on April 13, 1985. Her name was Dr. Anna Wilson Harrell, who was a core maker and long time employee of Stockham Valve Pipe and Fitting, Inc. This company was founded in 1903 by William Herbert Stockham with revolutionary inventions causing rapid growth in the 1900s in the steel industries.

The record shows Dr. Anna Wilson Harrell as a major stockholder until her death and transferred her stock to her daughter Ada. The records of Ms. Ada Mays Jones' late husband have also been removed. Mr. James Chester Jones, who passed away on May 11, 1987, has been hidden and concealed from the public in the Jefferson County Probate Court from the general public.

The criminal enterprise, considering the amount of money at stake, took extra measures to suppress, conceal and mutilate evidence of the murder that took place at the home of Ms. Ada Mays Jones. The coroner knew it was a murder, but the FBI knew the a murder would call for an official investigation, which would have caused exposure that was unwarranted due to the fact government officials had their eyes on the money.

Ms. Ada Mays Jones, a Christian woman, and pillar of the community, who boasted numerous awards for the best flower garden in Alabama for several years "was not" a sixty-nine year old "cocaine user." This was as far from her character as heaven is from hell. Ms. Ada Mays Jones died with undigested cocaine in her stomach. Anyone who knew Ms. Ada Jones would know, this was murder. This concoction was mixed in with her food as her State of Alabama Forensic Science, Birmingham Division Report of Toxicology

Analysis reveals under case file #27-8925658.

Ms. Ada Jones was poisoned on November 14, 1988 with an overdose of heart medication "mixed with cocaine." This mixture induced her heart rate to make it seem as if she died of a heart attack, or natural causes. This was also why her records are hidden in the Jefferson County Court.

Deputy Coroner Jack Parker of Jefferson County pronounced Ms. Jones dead on November 16, 1988 at 6:37 a.m. at her luxurious home. After receiving conflicting statements from Ms. Ada Jones' niece, who lived with her, the coroner knew that there was something very wrong from the amount of rigor mortis that had set up in her body. Ms. Jones had been dead for some time. When the coroner began to start the investigation, the FBI and the U.S. Attorneys began to interrupt to keep the lid on the story and the case. The government stepped in to silence the coroner and make sure that the death certificate stated "natural causes." This way they could manipulate the estate, and remove the rightful heirs without exposure. Meanwhile they could hide her will from the true recipients and cover up the murder, while having no press coverage.

The estate was handled by a probate attorney and her husband. They contacted the probate judge at the court to include him in the conspiracy while hiding the final will belonging to the heirs of the estate. Although it was known that Ms. Jones' niece was the one who poisoned Ms. Jones, the FBI and U.S. Attorneys had thirty-five million reasons not to cause any exposure.

Twenty-three months later, the niece of Ms. Ada Jones was threatening to talk and was found with several bullets in the back of her head. The murder remains unsolved because the murderers will never investigate "themselves."

The rightful heirs did not fear the Criminal Enterprise. While waiting for the attorney for the estate to read the final will and testament, the FBI and U.S. Attorneys were plotting to have him arrested to keep him silent and away from the estate. This criminal activity has been recorded in the Jefferson County Probate Court under case number 128 419. This case is the false value of the Ada Mays Jones' estate that has been embezzled and under the control of the Criminal Enterprises "operating under the Color of law."

The case against William Anthony Fagnes was created to remove him from the general public and keep everything silent. As reported (by me) in the Birmingham Times, June 12, 2008, U. S. Attorney Alice Martin has conspired with the associates "as a leader" to keep me in prison as long as they possibly can. For a complete review of all the facts and documents involving this case: go to William Anthony Fagnes v. United States #2:05-CV-8065-CLS TMP - under the penalty of perjury - Northern District of Alabama, which had been withheld from the public view.

The Criminal Enterprise took advantage of their oath to office as they forced the signature of the foreman of the Grand Jury as well as my signature on a fraudulent plea agreement. Mr. Terrell Clement actually signed an affidavit confessing that his signature was forged and he knew nothing about the case. These are the measures that the United States

Addressing America's Healthcare

Successful national healthcare reform must address access, quality and affordability issues in a comprehensive approach. Providing health care for all must also recognize and address health disparities that exist among minority populations.

According to the Children's Defense Fund, for example, Black children in the United States are five times more likely to die from asthma than their white peers. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, more than half of all uninsured Americans are racial minorities.

A study by the Mount Sinai School of Medicine recently found that Black women are more likely to have low birth weight babies, a condition linked to infant mortality.

A study by the Commonwealth Fund discovered that half of all Black Americans suffer from a chronic illness or disability, the highest rate among all racial groups. Meanwhile, the Journal of Epidemiology and Community Health found that Blacks have a 30 percent higher death rate than whites.

Indeed, in 2006 U.S. Surgeon General David Satcher concluded that about 84,000 deaths every year could

be prevented if g tween Blacks and nated.

Mrs. Jones estate was worth (46) million dollars.

Iris Elaine Hardy McNabb would be gunned down on October 12, 1990 by an assailant who shot her in the back of her head. Elaines death remains unsolved after she died on October 29, 1990.

The Obituary photograph at the bottom of the page on the right hand side is Elaine's mother Mrs. Ethel Mae Dallas Hardy who died on April 18, 1994. She was Mrs. Ada Lee Mays Jones sister-in-law she married her brother James Mason Hardy, Sr.

Iris Elaine Hardy McNabb and her mother Ethel Mae Dallas Hardy both is buried at Elmwood Cemetery in a family plot at (Lot 308) (Block 49).

The Sheriff's Department is executing a notice to Gwendolyn Davis on October 10, 1990 making her aware that Attorney Margaret L. 





According to officer Landers, the dec. was reported to have come downtown Birmingham on 11-14-88 and paid some bills. While in Birmingham she is reported to have entered an unknown named Chinese restaurant and ate rice, chicken, and egg rolls. About 2 hours later, the dec. experienced nausea, vomiting, and stomach cramps. She had repeated episodes of vomiting (12-15 times) throughout the night. No blood in the vomitus. Had 2 soft stools yesterday and today - but they were not watery and there was no BRB. Subjective fever and on no medications. No one else ate at the restaurant with the patient. The dec. entered Carraway E.R. at 1035 hrs. on 11-15-88 and was seen by Dr. Hoyt Price. The patient was alert and cooperative and in NAD while resting on a stretcher. Chest was clear. Heart had no gallops or rubs. Skin had no turgor or rash. Abdomen had decreased bowel sounds and was completely soft with no masses and no peritoneal signs. Neuro was intact with no lateralizing signs. At 1045 hrs. on 11-15-88 there was a temp. of 97, respirations of 20, a pulse of 120, and a B/P of 110/84. While in the E.R. the patient was given Vistaril 50 mg., I.M. and discharged at 1119 hrs. with rx. of 6 Phenergan 25mg. suppos. to be taken every 4 hrs. rectally for nausea and vomiting. She was to return to the e.r. if her condition got worse. She was to be on a diet of clear liquid. The hospital record reflects that there was a dx of possible food poisoning/ gastroenteritis.

The police report reflects that on the night of the 14th. the dec. was given Pepto Bismol and 7-up and both were vomited. The niece stated that the one and only Phenergan that was used was given to her at 0545 hrs. on 11-16-88. The niece said that there were no bowel

movement after the medicine was given. The niece then changed the dec. clothes and bed sheets and began feeding her chicken noodle soup and saltine crackers. After eating a few bites, the dec.'s head fell backward and no sounds were made by the dec. and there was no further response. Fire medics were called and responded at 0637 hrs. and determined that Ms. Jones was dead. The officer reported that the scene appeared unremarkable. Dr. Hoyt Price reported that no lab work was performed. The niece reported that the dec. did not get strangled while eating.

The hospital band had Mrs. Jones name on it stating that on 11-15-1988 approximately 10:45 P.M. she was brought to Carraway Hospital Medical Emergency Room by an ambulance on a stretcher and was attended to by Dr. Hoyt Brown Price, II a emergency room doctor at Carraway Hospital.

At no time have Mrs. Jones ever been a patient at Carraway Hospital Emergency Room. The perjury by Gwendolyn Davis was to deceive Coroner Jack A. Parker who knew from his expertise that Mrs. Ada Lee Mays Jones had been dead at least 36-48 hours and there was no way that she had been a patient at Carraway Hospital Medical Facility attended to by Dr. Hoyt Price about 8 hours before Coroner Jack A. Parker pronounced Mrs. Jones dead on 11-16-1988 at her residence.
